A. Class Size / Composition Grievance Process

The KTTA will be meeting again with the district on Friday, January 6th to discuss the grievance filed regarding class size and composition breaches in the district.

<u>We ask members</u> to continue putting pressure on school administration about alleviating class size and composition issues in the school as that message is reaching the Board office and is putting pressure on them.

We have completed and sent to the district all known breaches of elementary class sizes and lack of specialist teachers. We are completing the letter for the middle school / secondary class size/composition portion of this grievance this week. Please continue to provide this information through the survey (links noted in *C. KTTA Survey*)

Breaches:

The KTTA has noted in excess of 220 breaches of class sizes and composition for elementary. The district will be providing us with all the information they have for 425 elementary teachers.

The nature of the breaches for all classes are:

- 1) K or K/Primary Class Size: class sizes that exceed 20 in Kindergarten or K/Primary classes
- 2) Primary Class: class sizes that exceed 22 in Primary classes
- 3) Intermediate Single Grade: class sizes that exceed 29
- 4) Intermediate Split Grades: class sizes that exceed 27
- 5) Secondary Classes: class sizes that exceed 29
- 6) Science / English / Lab Classes: class sizes that exceed 28
- 7) Home Economics Classes: class sizes that exceed 26
- 8) Industrial Educatioin Classes: class sizes that exceed 24
- 9) Class Composition: any class with a student with designation are in breach of integration language as there was no plan prior to integration.
- 10) Class Composition: any class with more than three (3) designated students (high or low incidence)
- 11) Class Size / Composition: reduction of maximum based on number of low incidence students

The amount of information we are filtering through is large and we ask for patience while we are completing this process. We are also likely to have a number of meetings with the district regarding this matter.

B. Class Size / Composition Implementation Meetings Kamloops Thompson language attached and at www.ktta.ca (link at top of the page)

The BCTF has been negotiating with government on the implementation of the class size/composition language since late November. Some new developments to report are:

- 1) Superintendents had conference calls with BCPSEA and government;
- 2) The parties agreed to send a series of questions related to local process language *locally we* are meeting on Friday to complete this process;
- 3) There are meetings scheduled daily between the BCTF and government on implementation of funding and setting out timelines for staffing.

The BCTF is pressing to have positions posted in January to alleviate the class size and composition concerns in members' classrooms.

A "cheat sheet" is attached regarding class size numbers according to the pre-2002 collective agreement language regarding class size, composition, and specialist ratios.

Please copy one for yourself to determine if your classes so that you can have conversations with community members of parents noting what changes the Supreme Court of Canada decision will mean to their children's education.

The key points to re-iterate with the public and parents about the re-instated rights are:

- 1) This will mean smaller class sizes.
- 2) This will mean more 1:1 support for children.
- 3) This will mean school libraries are re-opened or open for longer hours.
- 4) This will mean more counsellor and special education support for children.
